

JACKSON TOWNSHIP MINUTES

The Board of Supervisors' regular meeting was held May 4, 2010, at the Jackson Township Municipal Building. Carl Remley called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM.

PUBLIC DISCUSSION AND COMMENT:

- Bruce wanted the pot holes on Piper Road to be fixed. He asked about chip and tar and was told that if he didn't get it last year, he couldn't get it this year. The township will have dust oil available for \$150 per 200 ft. Also, there is salt mixed with every truck load of stone put on the roads, which keeps the dust down.
- Ken felt that the township is discriminating when they decide who can get chip and tar and who cannot get it.
- Larry commented that the non-grade mixture with salt that was put on the road near him is doing a good job.
